Introduction

Hayle is located on the North coast of West Cornwall and services a large hinterland of local villages with a large population. Its population further swells because of the number of holiday beds in the town and surrounding area, second in number only to Newquay in Cornwall. The town is well positioned on the A30 and served by frequent mainline rail and bus links. Provision within the town for pedestrians and cyclists is relatively poor and has lacked recent development.

Hayle has two commercial centres, Copperhouse and Foundry stemming from the major part it played during the Industrial Revolution when it led the way in design and supply of high-pressure steam engines. While Hayle is incredibly proud of its World Heritage status, it is also forward looking: the site of the demolished power station has been reborn as the base for the pioneering Wave Hub project for testing wave powered electricity generating devices; Renewable Energy industry projects have been warmly welcomed at the newly built Hayle Marine Renewables Business Park and the historic harbour is part way through a multi-million pound development of retail, leisure and housing.

Hayle is renowned for its three miles of golden sands, stretching from Hayle Towans along the Black Cliffs, through Mexico Towans, Upton Towans and Gwithian to Godrevy, the beaches are well-used but never appear overcrowded. Much of Hayle Estuary is in the ownership of the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB) and is designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest. From the plethora of independent shops to the town's industrial revolution heritage and its natural environment, Hayle has the potential to offer a great deal to residents and tourists alike.

Project Background

Hayle Town Council (HTC) has carried out some place-shaping work including the development of the Hayle Neighbourhood Plan (2018) and the Hayle Growth Area – Concept Plan (October 2020). Hayle Town Team (HTT) was set up in 2021 and while well-supported by people from across many areas of the community at its inception, interest has recently waned. HTC recognises the importance of ensuring all voices in the town are heard so that any future investment funding take into account the needs and wants of Hayle's community. The long-lasting impact of the recent pandemic along with the change to the make-up of the town's population that occurs naturally over time means that this seems like an appropriate time to undertake a comprehensive stakeholder and community engagement that identifies strengths and weaknesses and establishes a collectively agreed "ambition" for Hayle.

In the January 2022 Welcome Back Fund/Covid Recovery report, the following key challenges were identified;

- No clear economic identity and lack of economic activity from mid-afternoon
- Many small businesses without a strong voice
- High volume of traffic going through the town
- No safe routes for active travel through the town
- No clear focal point/town centre
- Some youth facilities that need to be expanded

From this, the report suggested interventions around:

- An Evening Economy Strategy
- Chamber of Commerce Revamp
- An Active Transport Strategy
- A Multi-use Community Space
- A Town Square including Public Realm
- A Youth Offering

Hayle Town Council applied for initial European Regional Development Fund Town Vitality Funding in order to carry out feasibility studies to improve connectivity and active travel and leisure and sports facilities in the town. The bid was successful and after discussion with Cornwall Council it was suggested that prior to these feasibility studies being conducted, it would be useful for the residents of Hayle to create a shared vision for our town.

Project Context

PURPOSE OF CONSULTATION

Situ8 Planning Consultants and Mei Loci Landscape Architects and have been instructed to act on behalf of Hayle Town Team and Hayle Town Council, to produce a rigorous, transparent and inclusive programme of engagement and consultation to develop a Vision document for Hayle.

This document is vital for future funding bids to support place shaping work in Hayle, and so it has been essential that the engagement and consultation work has captured the opinions and aspirations of the 9000 people who live here, study here and of others who work here in Hayle Town Centre.

Hayle Town Council applied for initial European Regional Development Fund Vitality Funding in order to carry out feasibility studies to improve connectivity and active travel and leisure and sports facilities in the town. Prior to these studies taking place it has been essential that the community of Hayle are consulted and engaged with to create a shared vision for the town.

By way of background information which has been used to help inform our approach we have taken account of plans which have involved varying degrees of consultation with the community, including;

- Hayle Area Plan 2005-2025 - August 2006
- Hayle Town Framework - March 2017
- Hayle Neighbourhood Plan 2014-2030 - March 2018
- Hayle Growth Area - Concept Plan October 2020
- Hayle Town Plan - Welcome Back Fund / Covid Recovery - January 2022
- Cornwall Local Plan 2016
- The Climate Emergency DPD (Draft)

This report is not in support of a planning application as such, nevertheless through meaningful consultation to support any proposal is supported by Government legislation.

National Planning Policy Framework was revised on 20 July 2021. Early engagement has significant potential to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the planning application system for all parties. Good quality pre-application discussion enables better coordination between public and private resources and improved outcomes for the community.

When a Local plan is drafted by the local planning authority it is required that this is done in consultation with the community and this is considered good practice with any documents which ultimately has an impact upon that community.

Consultation Approach

CONSULTATION STRATEGY


Initially as per the brief we met with members of Hayle Town Team and Hayle Town Council and the community network officer to establish the parameters and to gain an understanding of the perceived opportunities and constraints facing Hayle's community. This was a good opportunity to agree how best to advertise upcoming events and outreach to the different groups within the community. Following a walk over with the Town Team we continued to work closely with Julie Baldwin, Projects and Events Officer for Hayle Town Council who liaised with our team and attended events throughout the process. The location and timings of consultation events were organised with the aim of reaching as many groups as possible across the town.

Consultation Themes



WHY THESE THEMES?

The consultation themes were developed to continue and build on the work started by the Hayle Neighbourhood Plan (2018), Hayle Growth Area – Concept Plan (October 2020) and the Welcome Back Fund/Covid Recovery Plan (January 2022).

The aim of our consultation was to focus discussions on what could happen next, what people would like to see happen in their town and from their ideas develop a vision for Hayle that results in real projects.

We wanted the themes to represent as many user groups as possible and provide a starting point for discussion and ideas.

Visitors were encouraged to complete a questionnaire or add their ideas to the boards using post - it notes. Our team also wrote up notes of our conversations with members of the public.

The consultation boards were made available to view online via the Hayle Town Council website alongside a digital version of the questionnaire that people could fill out in their own time. We created specific questionnaires for Hayle Academy and local Businesses with questions specific to these user groups.

We structured the consultation around these themes with the aim of filtering ideas into categories that would be eligible for a number of funding streams should Hayle Town Team and Hayle Town Council wish to take them forward.

Some Projects that are already happening...

HAYLE TOWN COUNCIL PROJECTS IN PROGRESS

Alongside the consultation themes we presented a list of projects that Hayle Town Team and Hayle Town Council already have in progress. The idea behind showing these projects was to share good news and promote Town Council projects.

Hayle Town Team and Hayle Town Council want to meet the needs of Hayle and make the most of the assets and spaces they manage and maintain. The study area for the vision and consultation covers land within Hayle Town Council control. These projects were shown to make people aware of the services, spaces and places Hayle Town Team and Hayle Town Council can influence.

1. PEDESTRIANISATION OF KING GEORGE V MEMORIAL WALK

Transform King George V Memorial Walk into a linear park by removing of all vehicular traffic from the walk and formalising its use as a pedestrian / cycle friendly space. Access would be maintained for the residential properties located on the Memorial Walk. This is subject to a Traffic Regulation Order - the consultation for this will be coming soon.

2. MAINTENANCE OF KING GEORGE V MEMORIAL WALK

Maintaining the King George V Memorial Walk park / planting alongside a team of dedicated volunteers.

3. NEW PARK

The creation of a new pocket park on Hayle Terrace at the old Hawkins Car site creating a new publicly accessible space for people to occupy and look over the Copperhouse Pool.

4. UPGRADING THE RECREATION GROUND NEW ROAD CROSSING

Ongoing maintenance and development of the Hayle Recreation Ground. Introduction of new seating in the playground and playing field area. Removal of graffiti, maintenance of the play equipment. A new level crossing point will connect the Recreation Ground across Lethlean Lane to the old railway line and on to King George V Memorial Walk. Resurfacing the skate bowls.

5. TOWN COUNCIL OFFICES RELOCATION PROJECT

Plan to relocate the Town Council offices from the Community Centre to an improved, multi-use community hub at the Library. A separate consultation will take place for this later this month.

6. EXPAND GP SERVICES

Potential to expand the GP services at Bodriggy into the current Town Council offices off the back of the relocation project in point 5.

7. A PROGRAM OF COMMUNITY EVENTS

Coordinating and helping to facilitate Community events such as the Gorsedh.

8. FUNDING TO SUPPORT COMMUNITY INITIATIVES


Funding to Support Community Initiatives, such as the Hayle Towans Ranger and their team of volunteers to help protect and preserve the natural dunescape, Hayle Day Care Centre (annually) for the elderly, Hayle in Bloom, Hayle Christmas Lights and Hayle Youth Centre. We also run a small grants scheme - where any local group or organisation can apply quarterly for smaller sums of money.

9. OPERATE, FUND AND OWN THE HAYLE LIDO

The Town Council will continue to operate the open-air swimming pool.



10. EXPANSION OF THE CEMETERY AND ALLOTMENTS

Consultation Response

IN PERSON COMMENTS AND NOTES FROM CONVERSATIONS

Over three hundred people interacted with at all the varying events. Notes were taken and people were encouraged to add post it notes to the consultation boards and fill out the physical or online surveys.




Hayle is a friendly town with a strong community that takes pride in its natural environment and the industrial heritage from which the town grew.

As part of a comprehensive place-shaping approach, proposals will be judged against fundamental design principles of: Character, layout, movement, adaptability, engagement process, avoid overlooking, overshadowing and noise disturbance.

Policy 13: Development standards

Policy 13: Development standards

Policy 14: Renewable and low carbon energy

Policy 16: Health and wellbeing

To improve the health and wellbeing of Cornwall's communities, residents, workers and visitors.

Policy 20: Managing the provision of waste management facilities

New or changes to existing energy recovery facilities should make use of a significant proportion of any heat produced by the recovery process to meet locally identifiable needs.

Policy 21: Best use of land and existing buildings

Policy 23: Natural environment

Development proposals will need to sustain local distinctiveness and character

and protect and where possible enhance Cornwall's natural environment and assets according to their international, national and local significance.

Policy 24: Historic environment

Development proposals will be permitted where they would sustain the cultural distinctiveness and significance of Cornwall's historic rural, urban and coastal environment by protecting, conserving and where appropriate enhancing the significance of designated and non-designated assets and their settings.

Policy 25: Green infrastructure

The existing green infrastructure network in Cornwall, which is important to recreation, leisure, community use, townscape and landscape quality and visual amenity will be protected and enhanced. Development proposals should contribute to an enhanced connected and functional network of habitat, open spaces and waterscapes.

Policy 27: Transport and accessibility

This policy will support proposals which provide safe and suitable access for all people and not cause a significantly adverse impact on the local or strategic road network that cannot be managed or mitigated.

THE CLIMATE EMERGENCY DPD (DRAFT)

The Council proposed modifications to the plan in document following Inspector examination and launched consultation on this stage of the process between Monday 25 July and Monday 5 September 2022.

The plan is gathering weight and we have made reference to the salient points made within that plan which support our approach towards a sustainable future for Hayle.

There is considerable evidence available regarding the decline of town centres. Whilst it is recognised that increasing density and encouraging other uses into towns can assist their vitality, it has also been acknowledged that this could help mitigate the impacts of climate change. Evidence suggests that compact, connected and co-ordinated places are more productive, socially inclusive, resilient, cleaner and have lower greenhouse gas emissions.

Increasing economic activity within towns would support high street vitality, reduce the need to use cars and encourage more sustainable forms of transport. Mixed-use buildings which are well served by public transport and with green spaces interspersed create a more vibrant town. More housing in town centres would also enable a night-time economy and generate greater footfall.

Each town centre is unique, they have their own economic geographies, specialisms, and character and distinctiveness. They are changing in different ways and have different relationships with the areas around them. The Council recognises that there are opportunities to create priorities through place-shaping and town centre renewal, setting a clear vision accounting for the town's characteristics and opportunities for growth and regeneration.

New development must be low carbon to ensure that it protects, enhances and

contributes to improvement of the public realm, green infrastructure assets, the historic environment and improves facilities for inclusive use. This includes the development of high quality, safe and secure facilities that support active travel, public transport, accessibility and cycling facilities in town centres, linked to the sustainable transport policies.

Policy TC1 - Town Centre Development Principles

1. Development in town centres should support, maintain or enhance the viability and vitality of the settlement, recognising that they are at the heart of the communities that they serve and may act as a wider service centre for a number of other settlements.
2. Support will be given for the diversification of uses and increase in the number of residential dwellings in town centres to support its long term sustainable, social and economic stability. This would be achieved through change of use, redevelopment, enhancement of the public realm and conservation and enhancement of the built historic environment and heritage assets and promotion of sustainable lifestyles by, for example, reducing the need to travel and improving access to public transport. Regard should be given to how the development proposed would help deliver or support the towns' Place Shaping Vision and Priorities, where such a document exists.
3. Development of community facilities and appropriate temporary uses that maintain or increase footfall and vitality will be supported. The provision of a range of high-quality residential dwellings using underused or redundant space will be supported.
4. All development should complement the local distinctiveness of our town centres, responding to the culture of the community and enhancing the historic built environment, including public realm; where possible improving conditions for active travel, public transport, play and general amenity including green infrastructure and open space and be designed for safety and security. The conversion of ground-floor retail units or redevelopment of buildings should encourage activity and vitality; where these are converted to residential use consideration should be given to retaining the historic street frontage and keeping an active use, such as for workspace or home office. Each town centre is unique, they have their own economic geographies, specialisms and character. They are changing in different ways and have different relationships with the areas around them. The Council recognises that there are opportunities to create place visions and priorities for a particular place through place-shaping and town centre renewal priorities, these will set a clear vision taking into account the town's role, characteristics and opportunities for growth and regeneration.

Policy TC2 – Place Shaping Vision and Priorities, including Town and Town Centre Renewal Priorities

The Council supports the development of locally led Place Shaping Visions and Priorities to help manage the transition of town centres to community

focused and sustainable spaces. Locally produced town centre strategies will be material to determining planning applications. Vision and Priorities should take a proactive approach to planning for retailing and related community and cultural facilities and services to:

1. support the role of the town centre to secure a sustainable mix of retail, facilities, housing and cultural facilities set within an attractive public realm to create strong, lifetime neighbourhoods;
2. provide a decision-making framework that helps maintain, manage and enhance the vitality of the town and provide a mix of uses including shopping and facilities which provide local goods and services, especially essential convenience and specialist shopping or valued local community assets, including pubs and social facilities;
3. identify areas where it would be appropriate to promote changes of use from retail to other uses and facilities, including the development of high-quality housing for a variety of residents, especially where they are accessible by walking, cycling and public transport and would support the town centre;
4. support attractions and uses that bring people into town such as markets including any facilities or changes to road systems and the creation of pedestrian focused spaces necessary to accommodate them and to contribute to the vitality of town centres;
5. manage and support distinctive clusters of uses to create diversity in town centres;
6. and to support:
 - a) the broader vitality and viability of the centre and add to its quality and diversity of offer;
 - b) sense of place, and local distinctiveness and identity;
 - c) community safety or security;
 - d) supporting transport through creating opportunities for accessing a number of facilities and services;
 - e) health and well-being and the social, cultural and heritage value of the centre;
 - f) improved public realm through conservation and maintenance enhancement of historic assets and their setting and other assets, green infrastructure provision designed to enhance the character and distinctiveness of each town centre, including where appropriate street trees, pocket parks and orchards and biodiverse public spaces;
 - g) opportunities for promoting shared travel solutions and co-mobility, including through the locations for car club vehicles and to support cycling including the provision of well-located suitable, highly accessible and safe and secure bike parking, charging and storage.

1. PEDESTRIANISATION OF KING GEORGE V MEMORIAL WALK

Transform King George V Memorial Walk into a linear park by removing of all vehicular traffic from the walk and formalising its use as a pedestrian / cycle friendly space. Access would be maintained for the residential properties located on the Memorial Walk. This is subject to a Traffic Regulation Order - the consultation for this will be coming soon.

2. MAINTENANCE OF KING GEORGE V MEMORIAL WALK

Maintaining the King George V Memorial Walk park / planting alongside a team of dedicated volunteers.

3. NEW PARK

The creation of a new pocket park on Hayle Terrace at the old Hawkins Car site creating a new publicly accessible space for people to occupy and look over the Copperhouse Pool.

4. UPGRADING THE RECREATION GROUND AND NEW ROAD CROSSING

Ongoing maintenance and development of the Hayle Recreation Ground. Introduction of new seating in the playground and playing field area. Removal of graffiti, maintenance of the play equipment. A new level crossing point will connect the Recreation Ground across Lethlean Lane to the old railway line and on to King George V Memorial Walk. Resurfacing the skate bowls.

5. TOWN COUNCIL OFFICES RELOCATION PROJECT

Plan to relocate the Town Council offices from the Community Centre to an improved, multi-use community hub at the Library. A separate consultation will take place for this later this month.

6. EXPAND GP SERVICES

Potential to expand the GP services at Bodriggy into the current Town Council offices off the back of the relocation project in point 5.

7. A PROGRAM OF COMMUNITY EVENTS

Coordinating and helping to facilitate Community events such as Gorsedh.

8. FUNDING TO SUPPORT COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

Funding to Support Community Initiatives, such as the Hayle Towans Ranger and their team of volunteers to help protect and preserve the natural dunescape, Hayle Day Care Centre (annually) for the elderly, Hayle in Bloom, Hayle Christmas Lights and Hayle Youth Centre. We also run a small grants scheme - where any local group or organisation can apply quarterly for smaller sums of money.

9. OPERATE, FUND AND OWN THE HAYLE LIDO

The town council will continue to operate the open-air swimming pool.


10. EXPANSION OF THE CEMETERY AND ALLOTMENTS



Q3 Do you think Hayle offers things for young people to do?









Q6 When you travel into Hayle, how do you usually get there?







Q9 Would you walk more within town if the pedestrian environment was improved with accessible crossing points and traffic calming measures?




